# THE HISTORY OF LONDON KORFBALL

This year the London and District Korfball Association is celebrating its Golden Anniversary.

Regrettably, due to the lack of volunteers for the EXCO there is little in the way of actual celebration planned at the moment but it does seem appropriate to remember all the clubs that have played under the LDKA banner over the years before they are all lost in the mists of time.

Therefore I have put together the attached resume of all the winners of our competitions (or at least the vast majority) together with a glossary of every club that has ever played, excepting of course the odd Tournament team and some of those really were pretty odd!

I hope that you will find this of interest and perhaps draw up a distribution list to ensure that it is passed around your members.

Although this history is certainly comprehensive some of the 1950's and 1960's tables are not complete so if you have a final league table from this era lurking at home please let me know as it may the crucial piece required to complete the jigsaw.

London is the oldest League in the country and until the formation of the Kent League in 1976 were the only League organisation in the country. The only other competition was in Derby where Hardale and Secondus played from about 1956 to 1967. Some Kent sides have played under the LDKA banner when we ran the Indoor Summer Micro at Crystal Palace during the 70's and 80's.

The word "District" attached to our name has allowed us in the past to include teams from well outside London. Particularly Stratton who played in Swindon; Essex Barbarians from Brentwood; and East Hants Hornets and Alton from the depths of Hampshire.

Regrettably however we have in the main been restricted to South London. Only Edmonton and Tottenham Green have played in our League from North London. Hopefully over the next 50 years we can expand more fully into the Northern reaches and affect a true pyramid structure through the lower leagues similar to the achievements in other sports.

On this note I give you the first 50 years.

# 50 YEARS OF LONDON KORFBALL

The London and District Korfball Association was founded in 1948, 50 years ago, which we all know because it is on our letter heading. The roots however go right back to 1946.

The first organised game of Korfball ever to be played in England or the United Kingdom for that matter was on 17th July 1946 at the "News of the World" Sports Ground in Mitcham. Those were the days when the News of the World was a newspaper and korfball was played with 12 players on each side. In August of that year the British Korfball Association was founded although no clubs actually existed.

Spurred on by all this enthusiasm a group of potential players travelled to Zeist in the Netherlands to learn more about the game which was no mean feat in the days shortly after the second World War. Legend has it that on the returning ferry Croydon Korfball Club was formed and on return to dry land first Wandsworth and then Mitcham Korfball Clubs joined them.

Croydon and Wandsworth were keen to commence competitive games and agreed to start a League in January 1948. Due to bad weather (korfball was only played outdoors in those days) the league was postponed to March when an abridged series of three games saw Wandsworth A become the first champions. The LDKA league really started in the September of 1948 when Mitcham became members.

In those days games were 12 a side with three divisions of four and players tried to cope with the options of which way to change after two goals. Was it A to B to C or C to B to A? The 12 a side game was played up to 1991 although from the 1989/90 season onwards separate leagues were played before and after the winter indoor league.

The full list of First Division Champions is:

The League stayed at one division until 1953. Throughout this 5 year period only one new club emerged (Bec in season 1949/50) however 1953 produced three new clubs and a second division was formed and the fledging league really became established.

By the 1955/6 season the league had swelled to 19 teams and a third division was started with teams initially playing each other four times during the season. There have been three seasons when the league was again reduced to two divisions.

The League reached a peak at 27 teams and on a wave of optimism ran a fourth division on three occasions. In 1977 clubs decided that they would prefer to play indoors during the colder winter months. Initially an indoor league was run in tandem to the outdoor league but eventually the outdoor league was suspended during December, January and February. Even this proved unpopular and in 1989 it was agreed to split the seasons into two separate leagues. This inevitably meant smaller number of teams in the league and so the fourth division was reinstated.

At the 1991 AGM the old 12 a side Korfball finally died and the League was for ever more only run as an 8 a side game.

# **INDOOR KORFBALL (SUMMER)**

The first tentative steps at two zone Korfball was in 1961 when the top seven clubs plus a combined side of the rest played a 14 match outdoor season which was won by Morden. However the first serious attempt at a regular 8 a side league came in 1971 when LDKA ran what became known as the Summer Micro league mainly at Crystal Palace NSC.

The reason for running an indoor league in the middle of summer was that it was the only period when sufficient time could be booked at Crystal Palace. Presumably everybody else wanted to be out in the sunshine!

Games were played on a mid week evening with each team playing twice on the same night. Teams only played each other once so the season was reasonably short.

In other years the league was played in pools with Championships playoffs at the end. The final season in 1988 attracted 30 entrants and the first division championship play off was between Vultrix and Nomads. Finally it was agreed that it was not sensible to play indoors in the middle of summer and the league was discontinued.

# **INDOOR KORFBALL (WINTER)**

By 1977 the success of the Summer micro had persuaded most clubs that an indoor league was a good idea and an even better idea was to play indoors in the middle of winter instead of fighting with the snow and cold weather on Clapham Common. So the winter indoor micro league was born. This proved such a success that in 1987 the BKA formed a National League with the London clubs from the top two divisions being joined by Kwiek and Kingfishers from Kent and Guildford from Surrey.

From then on the London champions could gain promotion into the National League however when third team won the highest London division (the second teams having long since departed to higher things) the BKA put their foot down and they were forced to remain in the London League in the hope that this would lead to the formation of new clubs.

# **OUTDOOR**

In 1991 the outdoor game was reduced to 8 players a side. This meant that there was a third more teams entered than in the previous 12 a side competition. The league was again played in two halves - Autumn and spring and the first season saw 30 teams enter. Teams were divided into 6 divisions of five by a complicated formulae established to calculate which teams started in which divisions.

# **AFTERNOON LEAGUE**

Philip Buttinger started an Afternoon Micro league which ran from approx 1973 to 1983. His aim was to encourage both new players and new clubs by offering them competition in a more relaxed format and at a lower cost and in this respect he was very successful. A number of clubs were formed who would never have otherwise have played korfball and you will find Paupers, Bonneville and Genyk amoungst others listed in the glossary.

The league was played over a number of rounds, some indoors and some out, so it is difficult to provide a list of annual champions. Suffice it to say that Springfield originated in this league and then went on to become founder members of the Kent League while two Hampshire sides, Alton and East Hants Hornets, were hoped to be the nucleus of a Hampshire league which sadly did not materialise.

# **JUNIOR LEAGUE**

Junior Leagues have been run by LDKA throughout its 50 year history. One of the great successes of the Afternoon League was to run a regular Junior League at the same venue as the Senior League and Sylvan was one of the few clubs ever to operate only as a junior side with no senior players. In those early days however there was only one age group and all the juniors were mixed together.

It is only in the recent past that juniors have competed in a wide range of age groups which had lead to fairer competition and must help the development of the sport.

Hopefully the large increase in the number of junior korfball players in the 90's will lead to a swelling of the numbers playing in the senior leagues as we enter our second 50 years and coincidentally a new millennium.
